

# **The process for obtaining a firearm/s from a recently deceased licence, provided you already have a firearm licence, is as follows;**

## **1. Obtain the serviceability form/s for the firearm/s.**

This is a form that identifies the firearm/s you wish to licence (with its serial number, etc). A licensed dealer can complete and sign this form on inspection of the firearm/s. A temporary permit must be applied for to allow you to transport the firearm/s. Please note that a dealer must also see the paper licence (of the deceased person) to be able to issue the serviceability form. Temporary Permits can be issued by the Police Licensing Department in Cannington Tel: (08) 9451 0000

## **2. Obtain a support letter.**

Either a property or club letter (if you own the property, you will be able to fill the form in yourself). The club you join, or the size of the property that you have access to; will dictate which firearm/calibre you may be able to apply for. Please note; if you wish to hunt with a firearm, you must use a property letter to apply for the firearm/s. Using a property letter will allow you to hunt (on a property that you have permission for) or use the firearm at a club. Using a club letter means you can only shoot the firearm at a club.

## **4. Complete an online application (addition).**
