

The process for obtaining a firearm licence for a Category C firearm (when you do not have a firearm licence) is as follows:

1. Obtain a property letter – This must be a Primary Production Property.

If you are a farmer who's owns a primary production property, then you will be able to fill the form in yourself. If you are not a farmer/owner of a primary production property, then somebody who owns a primary production property can nominate you to shoot on their property. Please note, you will only be able to shoot a category C firearm on the primary production property if approved. In other words, you cannot shoot the firearm anywhere else.

2. Complete a 20 question (multiple choice) Safety Awareness Test.

Beaton Firearms can assist with this test in store.

3. Choose/purchase a firearm.

If you have a firearm in mind please let us know and we can help you look into pricing and options. Once the firearm has been chosen/purchased, a B709 application needs to be submitted (by the dealer). Once this is approved, the category C firearm can be sent to the Dealer.

4. Obtain the serviceability form.

This is a form that a dealer can complete and sign once they have the firearm in their possession. It is a form that identifies the firearm you wish to licence (with its serial number, etc).

5. Complete an online application (original).

With the purchase of a firearm from Beaton Firearms; we offer application assistance (in store) at no charge. 6. Submit the Application.

You then take all of this paper work to the post office with 100 points of ID. This is where you submit the application. It is now a matter of waiting for correspondence from Police Licencing.

In simple, with the purchase of a firearm from Beaton Firearms' (and the supply of your support letter); we can help you do the rest. You would then submit the application at the post office with 100 points of ID.

If your application is succesful, you will need to show evidence of storage - I.E. Show them you have a safe and it has been fitted. Police Licencing will send you this paper work.
